## *How can decision makers create a favourable legal context for their environments?*

- Policy certainty
- Reduce Risk
- Access to the market
- Access to the grid (electricity)



#### Irish context

- Renewable Energy in Ireland accounts for 11% of total energy (heating, transport, electricity)
- RES-E is 33%, mostly wind with approx. 4,000 MW installed capacity.
- Historically very hostile policy environment for community led renewable energy, no support (only one community owned wind farm Templederry, 5MW)
- Very hostile environment for small scale and microgeneration (this continues today)
- Grid connections almost impossible to achieve
- **RES-H** is 6.5% No support for renewable heat before 2019
- **RES-T** is 7%



#### Where is Irish policy going?

- Support scheme for Renewable Heat RES-H (operational approx. 6 months, first installation due to open in March)
- Renewable Electricity Support Scheme RES-E (auction due in June 2020)
  - Community Preference category (community owned)
  - Community benefit fund (support for communities in vicinity)
  - Renewable Electricity Participation Scheme (citizen investment opportunity)
  - Mentoring supports
- Grid Connection changes (Consultation ongoing)



#### **Community Response**

- 300 Sustainable Energy Communities
- Building Ireland's first community based virtual power plant
- Planning citizen and community ownership of 3 solar farms
- Established electricity supplier, with direct purpose of supporting community led generation to buy and sell renewable electricity.
